SUBJECT: CCS REALIGNMENT PROCESS

The CCS Executive Committee met on March 29, 2007 to review and discuss the recent realignments affected in the Northern and Southern Conferences. This review and discussion takes place in accordance with CCS Bylaws, Article IV, Section 10:

### **Section 10 CCS EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE APPROVAL**

- (a) Basic Leagues, as adopted by each Conference, shall be approved by the CCS Executive Committee. The CCS Executive Committee shall return to the Conference for further consideration any proposed league which is not approved.
- (b) The CCS Executive Committee shall proceed as follows:
  - o No later than the third week of April, odd-numbered years.  
The CCS Executive Committee shall approve leagues as proposed by each Conference OR return proposed leagues to the Conference for further consideration.

After review the CCS Executive Committee has taken the following action:

- **Central Conference**: No changes were made to league alignment so the Executive Committee approved the current basic league structure to remain in effect until the next realignment cycle of the CCS.
- **Southern Conference**: The league alignment changes adopted by the Conference in a 28-1-1 vote of the conference members present and voting was approved by the CCS Executive Committee to remain in effect until the next realignment cycle of the CCS.
- **Northern Conference**: The league alignment changes adopted by the Conference in a 25-12 vote of the conference members present and voting was approved by the CCS Executive Committee to remain in effect until the next realignment cycle of the CCS.

Should any member school wish to appeal this alignment of schools within each conference, they may do so in accordance with the CCS Bylaws, Article IV, Section 11. Please be reminded that there are time constraints included in the appeals process. In order to have any appeal heard at the next CCS Board of Managers meeting, it would need to be received in the CCS Office no later than April 11. The rationale behind moving all the CPSAL schools into the PSAL

- The PSAL currently has bylaws already written for a wider scope of sports. So as schools in the newly formed PSAL grown and expand their programs, bylaws already exist to govern those sports, while the CPSAL currently does not have the same scope of sports bylaws.
- The PSAL WILL have to change some of their current bylaws to accommodate the new schools, however it was felt that the current name of the Private School Athletic League, was a better reflection of the makeup of the schools in the current Christian Private School Athletic League. Of course at any time a league may change their own name, but as it currently exists the committee believed moving all CPSAL schools into the PSAL was the preferred alignment at this time.
- In addition the currently CPSAL Commissioner's school would be moving to the WBAL, should the proposal pass and the current PSAL Commissioner's school would be remaining in the PSAL, which would provide an experienced Commissioner for the PSAL remaining in place, should the members of the proposed PSAL so desire.

## **CCS Bylaws Article IV, Realignment:**

### **Section 11 APPELLATE PROCEDURE**

- (a) Any school or league may appeal the placement of that school in any league, or that league formation, to the CCS Board of Managers as follows:
1. A requirement of such appeal shall be that the appellant school or league provide an alternative leaguering plan to the CCS Board of Managers.
  2. The appellant school or league shall solicit statements of support or non-support from all schools affected by the alternate leaguering plan.
  3. Such solicitation shall be in written form, copied to the Realignment Committee Chairman, and shall be sent to all schools affected by the alternate-leaguering plan.
  4. Such solicitation of support or non-support shall be sent within 20 calendar days of Conference approval of league formation.
  5. Notice of appeal, including letters of support and non-support and complete alternate leaguering plan, shall be filed with the Realignment Committee Chairman within 20 calendar days of Conference approval of league formation.
  6. Decision of the Board of Managers shall be final in all such appeals.
- (b) The CCS Board of Managers, upon receipt of an appeal(s) described above, shall proceed as follows
- o No sooner than 15 calendar days, nor later than 45 calendar days after receipt, the CCS President shall call a special meeting of CCS Board of Managers to consider the appeal(s).
  - o The decision(s) of the CCS Board of Managers on such appeals shall be final.
  - o The CCS Board of Managers may return the appeal(s), without action taken, to the Conference for reconsideration and subsequent approval by the CCS Board of Managers at a time and date set by the CCS President.
  - o Upon such return to the Conference, the Conference Chairman shall convene the Advisory Sub-Committee of the Conference for the purpose of reconsideration of the rejected league proposal(s) and formulation of substitute formation(s). The Conference Chairman shall convene a Conference meeting to discuss and adopt league formation(s) prior to the date specified by the CCS President for the CCS Board of Managers subsequent approval.
- (c) Upon re-submission of Conference leaguering plans, the CCS Board of Managers shall either approve the league formation(s) OR refer the unresolved issues to the CCS Realignment Committee for recommendation of league formation for that Conference. The CCS Board of Managers shall consider the recommendations of the CCS Realignment Committee and finally adopt leagues for the Conference.
